**RESOURCE CENTER:** A Quest for Godliness by J.I. Packer explores the depth and breadth of Puritan spiritual life. The Puritans’ faith, Packer argues, stands in marked contrast with the superficiality of modern western Christianity. In a time of failing vision and decaying values, this powerful portrait of the Puritans is a beacon of hope that calls us to radical commitment and action, both desperately needed today. THIS WEEK: MISSION UPDATE

We are God’s handiwork created in Christ Jesus to do good works which God prepared in advance for us to do. – Ephesians 2:10

Thank you so much for your recent donation to SGA’s CottonTales Project. We are very thankful to our mutual Father in Heaven who has brought our attempts to help these desperate families to fruition in part through your generosity and love!

By God’s grace and your participation, the CottonTales project is helping families who were either forced to flee the conflict zone in Eastern Ukraine with very few possessions, or who are still living within the conflict zone – amid the chaos, continued military skirmishes and mafia presence, the dire food, medicine and coal shortages, and the rubble. The crochet work these families are receiving is helping them to obtain basic necessities for their families.

One such woman is named Natalya, and she is a mother of two whose husband is an invalid and bedridden. She suffers from an internal hernia and severe asthma, which causes her continual breathing difficulty and asthma attacks. She is in constant need of medicine for herself and her husband, and even adult diapers for him. She doesn’t have a regular income because of the economic situation in the conflict zone, and it is just such people that we aim to help with the CottonTales project – the idea being to provide a form of work that they can do even in ten minute increments on their own time at home whenever they do not have enough work to get them by

Many of the women receiving help are believers ... Galatians 6:10 says “So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people ... and especially to those who are of the household of the faith,” so we are very passionate about helping these precious brothers and sisters in the Lord!

At the same time, a number of unbelieving refugees are also being provided with work through the project, and we hope to expand that number as demand on the American side expands. It’s a powerful testimony to those who are unbelievers when they hear that believers overseas want to help meet their needs even though they have never met them! Thank you for shining the love of Christ to them, beginning with an amazing display of love for fellow believers that He Himself said would be the basis upon which the world would know we are truly His disciples (John 13:35)! We are seeing previously unchurched people added to the church through this project and SGA’s other crisis relief efforts, which are administrated by local Ukrainian believers who are eager to encourage/evangelize the ones who are unsaved!
