THIS WEEK: MISSION UPDATE

Loving God through Missions

While in college I attended a conference where I witnessed a powerful slide show. First image, you see an emaciated Ethiopian while listening to *Empty people filled with care, headed who knows where* sung in the minor key. Next slide – two Muslim women attempt to shield their faces with their hijabs. *On they go through private pain, living fear to fear.* Next shot, Indian children playing soccer in a trash heap. *Laughter hides their silent cries*. And then the clincher, a woman wails over her bleeding son while Steve Green pounds it home with *People need the Lord.* I don't remember the rest of the video. Tears can have that effect on memory. But the producers made a powerful, salient, and accurate point. One of the great motivations for missions is compassion. Every sixty seconds 100 people die, and most of them are heading for a Christless eternity. While love for our neighbors should drive us to missions so should our love for the Lord.

Perhaps you never thought of it this way, but we love the Lord when we share with people who need the Lord – especially those overseas. Clearly our obedience to the mandate for missions honors God, but so does the fruit of the effort.

We see this in **Revelation 5** where the apostle John shares some direct revelation from the throne room of God. He beholds the angels falling down before Jesus and singing the words of **verse 9**:

Worthy are You to take the scroll and to open its seals, for You were slain, and by Your blood You ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation.

The hosts of heaven rejoice that our Lord has ransomed and redeemed people from every tribe, tongue, and nation. Every people group, language, and nationality will have representation in heaven. Interestingly the singers do not celebrate the number so much as the diversity of the ransomed saints. In God's wisdom He has ordained diverse eternal worship. This poses the question, "How does the diversity of worship glorify God?"

Renowned author John Piper answers this question with four reasons why diversity magnifies God.1[1]

- 1. There is a beauty and power of praise that comes from unity in diversity that is greater than that which comes from unity alone.
- 2. The fame and greatness and worth of an object of beauty increases in proportion to the diversity of those who recognize its beauty. These qualities in a book make it a classic.
- 3. The strength and wisdom and love of a leader is magnified in proportion to the diversity of people he can inspire to follow him with joy.
- 4. By focusing on all people groups of the world, God undercuts ethnocentric pride and puts all peoples back upon his free grace rather than any distinctive of their own.

While compassion and love for people should motivate us for missions, our love for God should do so even more. Missions fulfills God's divine purpose as it is impossible for those of every tribe tongue and nation to come to him, unless they hear the message of the gospel (*Rom.* 10:14). We love God through reaching out to all those our Father has ransomed to save. When we do so, we facilitate a diversity of worshippers who will glorify our God forever.
